NOTICE-- RULE 2073.5 OF THE CALIFORNIA RULES OF COURT

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, PURSUANT TO RULE 2073.5 OF THE CALIFORNIA RULES OF COURT, that the Presiding Judge of this Court is considering a request to provide remote electronic access to all or a portion of the public court records in the above entitled case, on the grounds that (1) the number of requests for access to documents in the case is extraordinarily high, and (2) responding to those requests would significantly burden the operations of the court.

In making its determination, the court will consider relevant factors, such as: (1) The impact on the privacy of parties, victims, and witnesses; (2) The benefits to and burdens on the parties in allowing remote electronic access, including possible impacts on jury selection; and (3) The benefits to and burdens on the court and court staff.

Case No. SC 55500

Pursuant to subd. (d) of Rule 2073.5, five days notice is hereby provided to the parties and the public before the court makes a determination to provide remote electronic access under this rule. The determination will be made on or after March 22, 2004.

A copy of this notice shall be given to the parties, through their counsel, and shall be posted on the court Web site. Any person may file comments with the court for consideration, but no hearing is required or scheduled to take place.

Please take notice that in the event remote electronic access is provided, the Court does not have the resources, and therefore determines that it is not feasible for the Court to redact driver license numbers; dates of birth; social security numbers; Criminal Identification and Information and National Crime Information numbers; addresses, and phone numbers of parties, victims, witnesses, and court personnel; medical and psychiatric information; financial information; account numbers; and other personal identifying information. Therefore, in the event remote electronic access is provided, the trial judge may make a separate order requiring any party who files a document containing such information to provide the court with both an original unredacted version of the document for filing in the court file and a redacted version of the document for remote electronic access.

In the event the court determines that it will provide remote electronic access, no juror names or other juror identifying information will be provided by remote electronic access.
